July 1, 1945 - January 11, 2024

Glenn K. Anders of Bybee, TN left this world for the next on Friday, January 11th, 2024. A graduate of CCHS and later ETSU, he returned to CCHS as a teacher in the fall of 1968 and retired from teaching in 1999. Glenn made a huge impact on the lives of many students during his 31 year career as a biology teacher. Inspired by his classes, many of his students went on to positions in the fields of health, medicine, and education. Never one to sit still, after retirement Glenn stayed busy with his garden and carpentry projects. He also enjoyed watching sports and westerns, visiting the Outer Banks of NC, and pursuing his appreciation of vintage advertising.

Glenn was preceded in death by his parents Jay and Pauline Anders and uncle Mutt Talley. He is survived by his wife Kay; son Andy; daughter Mandy and her husband Duncan Overton. He is also survived by his brother Lynn Anders of Florida and sister-in-law Pam; niece Katie; nephew David and family. Glenn is also survived by his sisters-in-law, Phyllis Blazer and Sue Clark; nephews Todd Blazer and Russell Blazer and their families; as well as Glenn's favorite cousin and friend, Festus Talley.

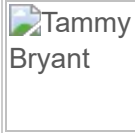

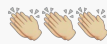

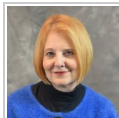
