Clay came from Rogersville, TN to Newport with Townsend Electric to build electric line for Newport Electric System. Jim Franks, then manager of Newport Electric Systems hired Clay as a lineman in January 1952. He was a lineman for 25 years and operating superintendent for 18 ½ years.

Clay served in the United States Army for two years, 1955-1957. He was a member of Newport Lodge #234, Knoxville Scottish Rite Bodies, and Kerbela Shriners, Knoxville, TN.

Clay met his wife, Wilma when she was 17 and he was 27. They shared 46 wonderful years together. Their marriage was made in Heaven, and their wedding vows, they honor till death do us part.
